Snowshoe hikers can explore winter at their own pace on routes like the Soleleitungsweg or the Eibenweg in the Fuschlsee area.

Whether ascending to Goiserer Hütte, exploring Krippenstein, or trekking along the Mondsee mountains, ski touring is increasingly popular in the Salzkammergut. The variety of routes ranging from easy to challenging—is extensive. Safety and respect for nature and wildlife habitats are always a priority, and many regions offer guided tours with certified instructors.
